Growth Mindset: The Power of Believing You Can Improve.

We all know that students who have a certain mindset, or attitude to learning, are more successful in school and are happier in their learning. Leading Psychologist, Speaker and Author Carol Dweck summarises it as follows: "In a Growth Mindset, people believe that their most basic abilities can be developed through dedication and hard work— brains and talent are just the starting point. This view creates a love of learning and a resilience that is essential for great accomplishment. Virtually all great people have had these qualities. In a Fixed Mindset, people believe their basic qualities, like their intelligence or talent, are simply fixed traits. They spend their time documenting their intelligence or talent instead of developing them. They also believe that talent alone creates success — without effort. They're wrong."

Carol's <u>TedTalk</u> is insightful and valuable and whilst it was recorded 10 years ago it is still 100% relevant to this day. I'd encourage you to watch it.

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How can parents and carers support? Understanding Growth Mindset and then making small, yet significant, changes in the way we talk to young people can have a lasting impact. Praise that emphasises efforts, actions, and strategies yield greater persistence and better performance over the long term. Praise that focuses on intelligence or talent promotes significantly less persistence and performance.
