### Headteacher's Weekly Roundup Spring A Week 4

St Bridget's Feast Day on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> February (traditionally the first day of Spring in Ireland) had the school bathed in warmer sunlight. The students are once again appearing outside in large numbers at break and lunch which is great to see. Your daughters (sons in Sixth Form) may have noticed that we have welcomed lots of visitors to the school this week including Ursuline Governors and Local Authority School Improvement Partners who support the work we do in reviewing and consistently delivering outstanding standards in all areas of the school. We thank them for their continued professional and voluntary commitment to the ethos and education provision of the school. Year 9 students have been engaged in really thoughtful conversations with staff about their options for GCSEs during our subject taster lessons and we are confident that this will result in as many more questions as it has offered answers. These will continue to be addressed and supported in the coming weeks.

#### Highlights of the week

Congratulations to Sophia (10U) and Toni (10T) for making it through to the regional finals of the Jack Petchey "Speak Out" Challenge this week. Sophia spoke on the topic of School Absenteeism, while Toni spoke on the Representation of Africa by Media.

On Wednesday, Judge Nicola Williams came into the school to present to Sixth Form students including those studying A' Level Politics and Sociology. Nicola Williams is a Crown Court Judge, both in law and as a writer. Unusually, for a modern British Judge she has defended people issued with the Death Penalty (she was a Commonwealth Judge and so worked on Death Penalty cases in other countries). Her fantastic life story and the significant impact of her life's work is a Serviam example for anyone. She, herself, is also an Ursuline student having attended school in Guyana.

#### Focus areas for next week.

When friendships become fraught and stressed, it is important to seek the support of staff in school. Form Tutors, Heads of Year and Pastoral Support Assistants are on hand as are all members of teaching and non-teaching staff should problems emerge. It's better to act to prevent difficult situations than repair the damage after making rushed poor decisions. Social Media is never the space to express frustrations or problems between friends.
