

On Friday 2nd February, Year 9 took part in their Taster Day. Students were provided with the opportunity to experience a snapshot of GCSE lessons ahead of making their GCSE choices.

From familiar lessons such as Maths, English, and Science, to a variety of new subjects studied at KS4, including Computer Science, Sociology, and Business Studies. Students were able to get a sense of what these subjects would be like to study at GCSE, and what the courses would cover in order to find the best pathway for them.

From a lesson on Migration in History, looking at form by painting an arrangement of objects in Art, style and composition by performing a Frank Sinatra track in Music, and the excitement of realising there are trips to physical businesses in Business Studies to provide students with a real world understanding of how businesses work, students had an eye-opening day into what the world of GCSEs entails.

The Taster Day was off the back of the Year 9 Learning Conference on 16th January where different pathways and options were introduced to students in preparation. Additionally, Year 9 Options Evening was held on 16th January, where parents were introduced to the various option pathways open to their child to study at GCSE, as well as future options at Sixth Form and beyond, in order for them to be able to fully support this process with the bigger picture in mind. The deadline for Year 9 Option choices is 8th March and we look forward to accommodating as many student choices as possible.

Judge Nicola Williams came into the school to present to Sixth Form students including those studying A Level Politics and Sociology. Nicola Williams is a Crown Court Judge, both in law and as a writer (she has written two books, Without Prejudice written 25 years ago, and Until Proven Innocent more recently in 2020- after being inspired to return to writing). Unusually, for a modern British Judge she has defended people issued with the Death Penalty (she was a Commonwealth Judge and so worked on Death Penalty cases in other countries). Her fantastic life story and the significant impact of her life's work is a Serviam example for anyone. The best news is, she, herself, is also an Ursuline student- having attended an Ursuline school in Guyana. Thank you so Nicola for your inspirational talk- the students really enjoyed it.
