### **Headteacher's Weekly Roundup Spring A Week 3**

Dear Parents and Carers

Year 7 and 8 students have been really focused on their Cumulative Assessments across all their subjects this week marking the half-way point in the year when they are tested on all the content studied so far at KS3. We look forward to sharing in the successes and discussing next steps when the results are published at Academic Review appointments at the end of this term. Further details below.

On Wednesday we hosted the Year 11 Parents' Evening with reviews of the December mocks and publishing of the full target report used as the basis of the teacher meetings. Attendance at 96% was excellent and the conversations were clearly focused on proactive next steps in the preparation for the GCSEs which are 12 teaching weeks away. Thank you to all the parents and carers for your engagement and support and also for the gratitude shared with the staff for the interventions and extra support being provided.

On Thursday, Lauren Wilmott, an alumnae who was a competitor on 'MasterChef the Professionals' visited the school's Food Technology department. She carried out a series of demonstrations and took part in a very lively and engaging Q&A session with the students. The students really enjoyed the experience, and we are really proud of and grateful for Lauren's achievements and support in giving back to her school.

### **Highlights of the Week**

Mrs Harrison and Mrs Milne directed 60 Year 10 students taking part in the Jack Petchey Speak Out Challenge in school on Tuesday this week. Visiting speakers from the 'Speakers Trust' came in to assist in the techniques of captivating and delivering to large audiences. The quality and competence of the students' delivery was absolutely incredible. Well done to all those students involved and good luck in the competition stages going forward.

Year 10 Assembly this week was excellently delivered by Jaselle, Martha and Lucy, three Year 13 students having completed the Holocaust project. The students gave accounts of their experiences visiting two concentration camps in Auschwitz. The Year 10s were captivated and very receptive to the powerful messages of never forgetting and hope in the future.

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### Focus Areas for Next Week

Continued focus on the pride in books at Key Stage 3, Year 7, 8 and 9. Basic standards: clear plastic covers on books, titled and dated work, underlined neatly, sectioned off work, glued-in sheets, personal trackers for grades and targets filled in and attached to the inside cover of the books, and finally general appearance and pride.
