Headteacher's Weekly Roundup Spring A Week 4

Dear Parents and Carers

Monday 27th January marked a special day in the school calendar as we celebrated the Feast of St Angela Merici. St Angela first formed the Company of St Ursula in Dezenzano, Italy, in 1553. St Angela inspired a movement and a community which is alive and flourishing today across the world and especially for us in this part of South-West London. All students celebrated Mass during the school week in our Local Parish Church of Sacred Heart. Thank you to all the staff and students who made this a special celebration.

At this point in the year, we return to our core ethos and mission and consider what is truly distinctive about an Ursuline catholic education. Students were reminded of their pledge at the Commissioning Service, we recall the Mission Statement of the school: *'Inspired by the life and work of St Angela, our Ursuline School commits itself to education for tomorrow's world within the dynamic tradition of catholic belief and practice. Thank you to all Student Leaders, Choir and Servers who prepared and participated in the Year Group Masses this week.

On Thursday morning I attended Merton Secondary Headteachers Meeting and was stopped by Keith Shipman (Inclusion Lead) to tell me how impressed he was by one of our students Isabella in Year 11, Co-chair of the London Youth Parliament. He was referring to an event held at Merton City Hall on Wednesday marking Holocaust Memorial Day on 27th January. Keith told me this event involved moving testimony and presentations from a range of different speakers. Despite the chamber being filled with adults, Isabella was one of the students who stood up to speak. I quote Keith when he said "she read so eloquently. It was a profound and moving evening. You would have been very proud to have seen her." Indeed, we are – and thank you Isabella for exemplifying the school's ethos and virtues.
