First of all, I would like to draw your attention to an advertisement for applications to become a parent governor of the school. The most significant highlight this week has been the Finals of the year 8 Philanthropy project. Weeks of effort by Year 8s culminated with a big presentation in the hall today. The presentations and leadership qualities of the Year 8 students has been stunning. More details to follow next week on the results of the Project but so far, the Project has succeeded in generating over **£8,424** funding for all the charities involved. This is a staggering and truly remarkable figure, smashing all previous records and is testament to the passion and energy for Serviam of all the Year 8s involved.

Congratulations to Anastasia in Year 13. We are delighted to announce that Anastasia has received an offer from University of Oxford this week for their Foundation programme in English Language and Literature. This programme is really competitive with only 80 students in 3 different subjects. Well done also to Mrs Harrison and Mr Vvedenskiy for encouraging and supporting Anastasia in her application.

Olivia (9B) continues to embark on further ambitious charitable fundraising initiatives. Over the Easter weekend, Olivia raised money for her chosen charity, Great Ormond Street Hospital, with another new challenge! In two days, she collected £273.15. 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Focus areas for next week

Parenting Resources

On Tuesday, as part of our commitment to supporting the health and well-being of our children, <u>Catch22</u> <u>Merton</u> delivered a Vaping Prevention Workshop titled "<u>Kick the Cloud</u>", to years 7-11.

Even though it is illegal for anyone under the age of 18 to buy/use vapes, according to the 2023 <u>Response to</u> <u>Youth Vaping report</u> from the Children's Commissioner, Dame Rachel de Souza, the number of children and young people doing so is increasing at an alarming rate. It is clearer than ever before that vaping is not safe, healthy, or wise and we don't want our kids to be doing it.

Smoking and the use of vapes at Ursuline High School

A reminder that smoking, including the use of electronic cigarettes (vaping) has always been prohibited on all school premises and whilst in uniform on the way to and from school. Smoking/vaping is also prohibited at all public transport stops and stations and on transport to and from school. Anyone found to be vaping in school uniform both in and out of school will be at risk of fixed term suspension or exclusion. 


Figure 1. Parents views on whether their child has vaped, by child's age group.
