We are pleased to announce that exams are underway! The GCSE written papers started this week, and I have been incredibly impressed with the confident demeanour of Year 11 who appear primed and focused. There is a tangible resilience and courage in these young people which bodes well.

In a change to previous years we now host the Year 10 exams earlier in the year to provide an opportunity to respond to the data in the remaining weeks of Year 10 rather than wait for return in September of Year 11.

#### Highlights of the week

This week the school and staff received lots of messages from Year 13 students (and for Year 12 Level 2 Programme students who also celebrated their last day in school today, Friday 9<sup>th</sup> May), and their parents and carers, as they finished formal scheduled lessons and enter the season of exams. These messages have a very significant and lasting impact on the staff and the school in what can be, at times, a challenging job. The messages are affirming of the impact in committing to a vocational career, so thank you to parents and carers. At the end of the Celebration Mass at Sacred Heart Parish Church on Thursday evening I spoke to parents and carers when I said, 'thank you for trusting your most precious children to us over the last seven years (or 2 years), thank you for your patience and accompaniment when we didn't get it right and for your gratitude when we did.'

Canon David's sermon was very powerful and impactful when he reminded the students or the power of faith as they transition into the next phase of their life and also on how important attending Mass can be during exam season.

#### Focus areas for next week

With the start of exam season next week, we ask all students to understand the importance of thinking about others. Students will need to be encouraging and supportive of our students in Year 11 and Year 13 as they sit important Public Examinations. Students not taking exams are being encouraged to be self-aware and regulate their voices and behaviour -1-
