Welcome back to the start of the Summer term which began with the sad news on the death of Pope Francis on Monday 21st April. Pope Francis was a leader who inspired the world with his unwavering commitment to peace, justice, and compassion for all, may his soul rest in peace. His teachings, align seamlessly with those of St Angela Merici and will continue to guide us as we strive to live out the values of faith, love, and service to others in our school community. We marked the significance of this event in school with a series of events including assemblies celebrating the life, and now legacy of Pope Francis. On Wednesday, we held a well-attended voluntary Low Mass for the repose of Pope Francis' Soul and also in gratitude for the life of St Francis. A book of condolences was opened in the school foyer, which is filled with heartfelt and personal reflections.

Getting the opportunity to speak with students who attended the School's Ski trip to the Dolomites in Italy over Easter. Despite an incredibly delayed return, the students all commented on how much they enjoyed the interaction with staff on this incredible trip exploring the glacier in the Passo Tonale.

I also spoke to students in the school HAF trip programme over Easter which included theatre trips and restaurant visits.

On Thursday, Year 8 students had the enriching opportunity to visit Baitul Futuh Mosque in Morden, one of the largest mosques in Western Europe. The visit offered valuable insight into Islamic faith and practice, enhancing students' understanding of religious diversity and community life. The tour reinforced the idea of the mosque as both a spiritual and social hub within the Muslim community. Throughout the visit, students engaged with curiosity and respect, asking thoughtful and insightful questions. Topics of interest included comparisons between Islamic and Catholic beliefs and how Islamic faith influences the everyday lives of believers.

Parenting Resources

The importance of nutrition as part of exam preparation and performance.

In the run up to the Year 11 & 13 GCSE and A Level Exams, the articles linked below discuss the importance of hydration and a healthy diet as part of exam preparation and performance, and in maintaining energy levels, concentration and memory retention. You will also find some slow-release carbohydrate and protein breakfast ideas and some healthy snack ideas to pack on exam days (remember, no nuts at school – however, they do make an excellent snack for home for those that can eat them).

Also, sleep is hugely important for learning as well as concentration and brain processing. Restricting sleep has been shown to impair athletic and cognitive performance and increase anxiety.

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We encourage you to explore these materials with your child and discuss ways to ensure good nutrition is incorporated into their daily routine.
