One event which won't feature in the *Inform* is the Teach Wimbledon Graduation ceremony hosted at the Ursuline on Thursday 10th July. This organisation was established by the Ursuline High School and Ricards Lodge, partnered with Roehampton University, to create a pathway for local talent in recruiting and training to become teachers. 28 graduates completed their teacher training qualification in both the primary and secondary sector and are ready to embark on their new careers in September.
