WHAT SKILLS AND INTERESTS DO I NEED FOR THIS SUBJECT?

This course provides a broad area of study and if you are interested in learning to communicate in German, if you love learning about the German-speaking world, this course could well be what you need.

Students study technological and social change, looking at the multicultural nature of German-speaking society. You will study highlights of German-speaking artistic culture, including art and architecture, and will learn how Germany's political landscape was formed.

We also explore the influence of the past on present-day German-speaking communities. Throughout your studies, you will learn the language in the context of German-speaking countries and the issues and influences which have shaped them. You will also study texts and films and have the opportunity to carry out independent research on an area of your choice. There is also the opportunity be subsidised to spend a week long work experience in Germany in February.
