## **Autumn Term B 2022**

#### Dear Parents / Carers,

As we approach the end of the Autumn Term, I am delighted to see how well Year 10 have continued to settle into Key Stage 4. GCSE courses are now well underway, and the Year 10 students have diligently and conscientiously risen to that challenge. Also, they continue to live out the ethos of the school in all that they do inside and outside of the classroom through their contributions to Serviam activities.

During this half term Year 10 participated in many external events: students attended the National Grid Energy Challenge and learned about the London Power Tunnel project (the purpose of the 'Challenge' is to highlight the importance of STEM in future careers), Emma Towuaghantse, Mia Gallagher, and Ellen Walsh travelled to the Women of the World 'International Day of the Girl' event on the Southbank, which involved a speed networking event on the London Eye with women who are leaders in their professions. They then went to County Hall and heard from the truly inspirational keynote speaker Dr Shola Mos-Shogbamimu. Several Year 10 students also participated in Remembrance Day Services at Wimbledon College, Kingston, Wimbledon Village, and the Lord Mayor's show.

Year 10 also had a visit from an influential and informative guest speaker from the Holocaust Education Trust. Born in 1939, Marcel Ladenheim, a Holocaust survivor, shared his experience of hiding in France, while his father was sent to Auschwitz in 1941. The talk was followed by a Q&A session and the feedback from Year 10 was overwhelmingly positive.

At the end of the Autumn A term, the enrichment feedback from students was that they wanted a Basketball club, and a Senior Netball club on a separate day to the Triple Science lesson. These clubs are now running on site on a Wednesday (Netball) and a Thursday (Basketball). There is lots on offer for Year 10s to get involved with, so please do encourage your daughter to sign up if she has not already done so; or to let us know if there is something she would be interested in if it is not currently offered. Enrichment is so important to students' well-being, and even more important while they are working hard for their GCSEs.

Our term closes with our expansive Advent Programme designed to reflectively prepare for the Nativity of Christ including our Christmas Gift Appeal, Christmas Tree Service, Christmas Jumper Day, Christmas Carol Service, Senior Citizens Christmas Party, and Christmas Staff and Students' Lunch. Year 10 raised at fantastic £212.25 at their Christmas fundraising fair, with the proceeds going to the young carer's charity; Honeypot - we are so proud of their efforts.

We have lots to look forward to in the Spring A half-term including the Wimbledon Partnership visit to King's University, Maths and Careers Speaker series, Intermediate Maths Challenge and Form Retreat Days. Congratulations again, to all of Year 10.
