#### Why the need for a Global **Reading Project?**

Reading widely and diversely, exposes the reader to different worlds and cultures, introduces new perspectives and ways of looking at the world, in ways that films, television shows, and blog posts are simply unable to. It's also one way to increase the demand, and therefore the supply, of books by BAME authors or books that feature BAME protagonists! (Research undertaken at London's University College between 2006-2016 has shown that only 8% of young adult fiction books published in Britain were by authors of colour).
