LESSON TOPICS: SPRING A TERM

RE Programme

Year 7 will study of the sources of authority within the Catholic Church, including the role of the Bible and the Magisterium. They will then use this knowledge to begin a detailed study on how belief in the Trinity developed from the Bible and the Early Church.

Year 8 will embark on the study of Islam where they will explore the answer to the Kev question, 'How does being a Muslim affect a person's life?' The unit will consider the following questions: When and where did Islam begin and what is its relationship with Judaism and Christianity? What are the different groups within Islam? What are the Five Pillars and how do they affect the way a Muslim lives their life? Are actions more important than beliefs for Muslims? What challenges do Muslims face when putting their beliefs into practice in 21st Century London? Why are the role of women and beliefs about war and peace controversial topics for Muslims?

Year 9 will complete their second unit of GCSE course, 'Incarnation' move on to the third unit of GCSF course, 'The Holy Trinity/Triune God' in which they will study Psalms and the use of music in worship; Acclamations used in Mass: the Biblical basis of belief in the Trinity; The Trinity in the Nicene creed and Genesis 1; The Influence of the Trinity on Christians today; The Trinity and God's love; The Magisterium's views on the Trinity; Baptism; prayers/postures.

Year 10 will complete the studies on Religion, conflict and peace then move on to GCSE course on Judaism: beliefs, teachings and practices. They will consider the nature of God; Judaism teachings and beliefs in the afterlife; the nature and role of the messiah: The Promised Land and the covenants with Abraham and Moses; Key moral principles; sanctity of life; Free will and Mizvot; the importance of the synagogue; the Shabbat; Bar and Bat Mizvah; marriage; mourning the dead; dietary

laws; Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur; Pesach.

Year 11 will finish off GCSE course on Judaism: The importance of the synagogue; the Shabbat; Bar and Bat Mitzvah; marriage; mourning the dead; dietary laws; Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur; Pesach. Students will then move on to finish the last unit of Catholic Christianity, 'Eschatology' which includes: The Paschal candle; Michelangelo's painting, The Last Judgement'; Memorials of the dead; Eschatology and life after death; The four last things; Purgatory and Judgment; The Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus; Cosmic reconciliation; The Church's teachings on the end of time; The last rites; The funeral rite; The care of the dying and euthanasia.
