WHAT WILL I STUDY IN THIS SUBJECT?

Year 1

G451: An Introduction to Physical Education

Sections include Anatomy and Physiology, Acquiring Movement Skills and Socio-Cultural Studies relating to participation in physical activity. Candidates appreciate the role of the cardiovascular system, understand the nature and development of motor skills and explore contemporary sporting issues.

G452: Acquiring, developing and evaluating practical skills in Physical Education Candidates gain an appreciation of the nature of performance, its evaluation, and what can be done to improve it. They record their observations as part of their coursework.

Year 2

G453: Principles and concepts across different areas of Physical Education. This Unit has two sections; Section A: Socio-Cultural options and Section B: Scientific options. Section A: Socio-Cultural options. Candidates study three of the five possible options, at least one option, must be from Section A.

G454: The Improvement of Effective Performance and the Critical Evaluation of Practical Activities in Physical Education

Learners will appreciate the key application of practical skills to achieve performance. They will also grasp the methodology surrounding the evaluation, appreciation and improvement of performance.

WHAT SKILLS AND INTERESTS DO I NEED FOR THIS SUBJECT?

You must have an interest in the science of sport.

You must be able to analyse your own performance with confidence.

Outside of school you should play 2 sports at club level for your practical assessment.

You must have the skills to complete wider reading on the subjects taught.

N.B the Physical Eucation course is shared between the Ursuline High School and Wimbledon College sites i.e. students take two of their lessons at Ursuline High School and four of their lessons at Wimbledon College.
