


PSHEC

The Personal Development Programme is delivered through the assemblies which are led by the Head of Year, other key speakers and Ursuline Staff.

What's Involved?

Each Society consists of two year 12 student leaders. The two leaders then ask others to assist with their society and form a committee

Each society organises a talk, debate, lecture or **discussion** involving current affairs and/or guest speakers, an academic enrichment event or trip and a charity/ fundraising event.

How it works

Leadership term runs from January- December

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Sixth form students take on leadership through mentoring, chaplaincy work and student buddy systems. A **Head Girl** and two **Deputy Head Girls** lead a team of **senior prefects** who are elected in Year 12.
