Uniform Policy

Ursuline High School

Ursuline High School (UHS) policies and procedures relate to its operation, staff, facilities, health and safety, risk management and services provided.

UHS strive to ensure equality of opportunity for all. This policy forms part of UHS commitment to create a positive culture of respect for all staff and students. The intention is to identify, remove or minimise discriminatory practice to ensure fairness and consistency for all those covered by it regardless of their individual differences and value the diversity of all individuals and communities.

As part of its development, this document and its impact on equality has been analysed and no detriment identified.

Ursuline Ethos / Mission Statement

The uniform at Ursuline High School plays a very important role in maintaining high standards and we are extremely proud of its unique identity. It instils a sense of belonging to the community and avoids divisiveness, enabling students to be proud of their school and its values.

In line with guidelines set out by the DFE and published in November 2021, Ursuline High School has tendered for a new supplier while incorporating slight changes to the specification of the uniform, ensuring value for money, reducing branded items and allowing for easy access to good quality second hand uniform.

In line with the Children's Wellbeing and Schools Act 2025 we have limited our branded items to 3 which must be purchased from the uniform supplier, all other items may be purchased from online or high street retailers in addition to the uniform supplier.

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Uniform Supplier

A new contract was awarded to Schoolwear Inc, Worcester Park, commencing on the 1st January 2023. The contract was awarded based on the best value for money, geographical proximity, and online access.

Branded items have been kept to a minimum.

As this is a single supplier contract, regular tendering will be implemented to ensure competitive quality and prices. The contract will be re-tendered every five years.

Second Hand Uniform

Any used items of uniform including bags, in good condition, can be donated to the school. We use this to provide emergency uniform to students and to provide to families who may have financial difficulties.

Where sufficient stock is available will arrange a sale of second-hand uniform to the wider community via second-hand uniform sales coordinated by the Ursuline Parents' Association. The UPA can be contacted at UPA@ursulinehigh.merton.sch.uk

Schoolwear Inc also provides the school with an incentive plan, whereby the school receives a percentage of profits (5%) to be utilised towards a uniform fund. The school will manage the fund to meet, where possible, those students in need of support. This will target those students purchasing uniform in Year 7.

Uniform list – Year 7

Must be purchased from Schoolwear Inc:

- Royal blue blazer with embroidered Ursuline High School badge
- Royal blue pleated mock kilt – skirts should not be altered in any way and must be worn at knee length OR Royal blue trousers (alternative to kilt)
- PE top with correct house colour

May be purchased from any retailer:

- Blue (not navy) V-neck knitted jumper. No cardigans [Example 1](#) [Example 2](#)
- White reverse collar blouse (long or short sleeve) [Example 1](#) [Example 2](#) [Example 3](#)
- Navy PE shorts (not cycling shorts) or joggers [Example 1](#) [Example 2](#) [Example 3](#)
- Plain black rucksack with no logos and sufficient space for laptop/tablet. No handbags. [Example 1](#) [Example 2](#)
- Shoes – plain black with a sensible heel (5cm maximum) must be polishable. No platforms, sling backs, trainers, plimsolls, or boots at any time. Ankle must be visible. [Example 1](#) [Example 2](#) [Example 3](#)
- Pair of trainers, suitable for sporting activities - (not plimsolls)
- Coat/jacket – black/navy only, with sleeves, no logos, no denim/leather/fur. Expensive branded coats/jackets should not be brought to school.
- Tights - plain black/navy or neutral tights, no patterns, must be worn. Or plain black/navy or white knee length socks.

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Smart phones/Smart watches are not permitted for Year 7.

Full school uniform must be worn at all times.

In warm weather the school will withdraw the requirement for jumpers and blazers. A notice will be published on the school website and 24hrs notice given for a return to full school uniform expectations. Where temperatures reach in excess of 30 degrees students can wear their PE kit to school. A notice will be published on the school website and 24hrs notice given for any changes.

Consequences for failing to adhere to the School Uniform Policy can be found in the School Behaviour Policy and may include being sent home to dress correctly.

In cases where it is suspected that financial hardship has resulted in a student not complying with this uniform policy, staff will take a mindful and considerate approach to resolving the situation. Where issues arise with adhering to this policy students must be sent to school with a note from a parent explaining the issue and when this issue is expected to be resolved. This note must be signed by the student's Head of Year.

The school will consider reasonable adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality/protected characteristics. These will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Students/parents requesting adaptation of the uniform should make representation to their Head of Year before any adjustments to their uniform are made.

Accessories and Make-up

Jewellery

One pair of earrings, studs with one stone or small hoop in the earlobes.

One necklace of a religious nature may be worn.

Anklets, nose studs, tongue studs, or any other facial or body piercing are not permitted.

Tattoos are not permitted.

Inappropriate jewellery will be confiscated and returned to the student at the end of the half term.

Students can and are encouraged to wear a wristwatch. Smart Watches are not permitted.

Hair and make up

Hair accessories (including headbands, hairbands, scrunchies, hair slides, small bows, or braid beads/cuffs/rings/spirals/cords) must be black/navy or metallic gold or silver.

Bandanas, durags, wraps, and bonnets are not allowed to be worn with school uniform.

A headscarf for religious reasons is permitted, which must be black, navy or white.

No makeup or nail varnish, false nails, false eye lashes or lash extensions may not be worn to school.

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Coloured contact lenses must not be worn.

Outdoor coats

Sensible outdoor coats may be worn on the journey to school. However, outdoor coats must be removed when students enter the building. Coats should be kept in the student's locker for the duration of the school day. **Coats and jackets must be black or navy, with sleeves, no logo, no denim, leather, or fur are allowed. Expensive branded coats should not be brought to school.**

Scarves, Gloves and Hats

Scarves, gloves and hats may be worn in plain black or navy only. However, scarves, gloves and hats must be removed when students enter the building and should be kept in the student's locker for the duration of the school day. Headscarves for religious purposes are permitted but should be black, navy and white.

Equipment

Students must provide their own padlocks to keep lockers secure.

All uniform must be clearly marked with the student's name, as should all clothing, textbooks, exercise books, etc.

Smart phones/Smart watches are not permitted for Year 7.

Mobile phones, airpods/earphones/headphones MUST be kept in lockers, or these will be confiscated, and a letter sent home for a parent/guardian to collect the item.

Ear defenders may be permitted at the discretion of the SENDCo and this will be documented in the student's Learning Support Plan.
