# **Highlights of the Week**

The Year 8 Philanthropy project culminated with a big presentation in the hall today, Friday 26<sup>th</sup> April. The presentations and leadership qualities of Year 8 students today were stunning. More details to follow next week on the results of the project but so far, the project has succeeded in generating £8424 funding for all the charities involved. This is a staggering and truly remarkable figure, smashing all previous records and is testament to the passion and energy of all the Year 8s involved.

The Ursuline High School in conjunction with St Philomena's High School, Carshalton and the Archdiocese of Southwark have co-constructed and run an RCIA programme for the purposes of welcoming into the Church adult members of staff working in our Catholic schools. Congratulations to Mr Nichols and Mr Barton who have both completed the programme, formally engaged in the sacramental journey and welcomed into the faith by Cannon Victor Darlington, Episcopal Vicar for the South East. Families and staff took part in these services culminating last week with a Mass in the Church of St Philomena's school. This special and unique programme began 2 years ago and provides an important avenue for committed staff in our Catholic schools to journey in their personal faith journey alongside their commitment to Catholic education.









# Focus areas for next week
