On Thursday evening we hosted the A' Level and GCSE Art Exhibition. Highlights of the Week

On Wednesday 45 of our students represented the Ursuline High School at the now annual Merton and Sutton Deanery Schools Mass celebrated in our mother church of Southwark Cathedral. Children and students from 14 schools celebrated the 'Year 6 Going forth' Mass marking the end of Primary and transition into secondary school. Fr Gerad Bradley, the Episcopal Vicar for the Archdiocese of Southwark, thanked all our communities for the 'extraordinary work' being done in our schools in preparing our young people for a life of faith. Representatives from Year 7 through to Sixth Form students participated and so inspired and reassured the Primary students about to embark in this move.

Focus areas for next week

The school policy on mobile phones and smart phones is really clear, they must not be used anywhere inside the school grounds. If students do have them, they must be turned off and placed securely in lockers. They will be confiscated if students violate this rule, and we ask parents and carers not to challenge the school when this happens as the rules will be consistently applied to all. Parents and carers may have noted that secondary schools in Southwark have collectively joined forces to ban all smartphones for students in Year 7 to 9. We have not agreed this course of action, but smart phone usage is not permitted in the main school for Years 7 to 11 in the school day and this rule will be rigorously applied to all. I refer parents and carers to the resource below Johnathan Haidt 'The anxious generation' exploring the link between anxiety and smartphone/social media



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technology. Parents and carers being the first educators of your children will find this interesting. Parents and carers need to be educated on this so that we can work together to understand the risks in unregulated access to smart technology. Also please be aware Smart phones will no longer be permitted in school for students in Years 7 to 11 as they compromise assessments, enable access to apps we cannot control or monitor in school and are banned by JCQ the exams regulatory authority
