### Smart Devices and Social Media guidance in the run up to Christmas

Internet Matters' CEO shares [valuable advice](https://www.internetmatters.org/valuable-advice/) and launches ['My Family's Digital Toolkit'](https://www.internetmatters.org/my-family-digital-toolkit/) for busy parents/carers to put online safety measures in place now ahead of the hectic festive season.

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Remember, Social Media has a minimum age of 13, which means Year 7 and the majority of Year 8 students should NOT currently be using it. Should parents and carers agree to give access once their child has reached 13, we strongly advise you follow expert advice and research the app to understand the dangers and risks, ensure accounts are set up with the right date of birth, use parent controls and family pairing. Please remember, in accordance with our Digital Learning & Safety Policy (and the current minimum age of 13), Social Media will not be tolerated at school, and there will be consequences for failing to comply with this policy.
