With *Whoppi Goldberg* providing a memorable performance as lead character *Deloris* in the 1992 film, we were all very excited about this production. Students had to really up their performance game to do the story justice, and indeed they did! There was a fantastically paced and sung interpretation of the main role of *Deloris* from *Portia Kargbo*, while a sympathetic portrayal of *Eddie*, the would-be love interest of Deloris was delivered by *Stella Bennett*.

While on Tuesday 16th December, Year 11 took part in a CV Workshop and Pathways CTM Presentation on Teams!


Paying Our Respects!
