As is usual Year 8 further learnt about local social issues within the community and were then posed the challenge of choosing a local charity to represent.

Students then virtually met with their chosen charities (**Angela**: Refuge, **Bernadette**: The Salvation Army, **Catherine**: Lives Not Knives, **Francis**: STEM 4, **Margaret**: Refugee Action, **Teresa**: Jigsaw4U and **Ursula**: STEM 4) to learn more about their work and figure out the best way to go about planning activities in order to support them. Students raised money in a variety of

ways including; sponsored runs, bake sales, lolly sales, raffles, making goodie bags and offering car washes. The overall amount raised for student charities across the project equals £4677- an amazing effort, well done all!

The virtual Philanthropy Final was held on *Friday 16th July*. Congratulations to winners 8 Francis who's who won £1000 for their chosen charity; STEM4 (working to support teenage mental health), with 8 Angela receiving a special commendation for their work with chosen charity Refuge (working with those suffering domestic abuse). 
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All About Wimbledon!
