On Wednesday 19th October, we held our annual Careers Fair at UHS! Students across Years 10 -13 had the opportunity to receive seminars and key advice from a variety of different professionals and university partners. These included; St Raphael's on Volunteering for Work Experience, Dr Gaby Tamura Rose and Nurse Maura Flint who spoke on the personal reward of the care field, Birmingham University with 'Top Tips for Personal Statements', Love Wimbledon promoting local opportunities and a talk from **Schlumberger Cambridge** research, on engineering and attracting girls to STEM subjects. Additionally, there was a Osteopath career talk from the NHS, Royal Holloway presented on 'What's It Like To Be A University Student?' and a London Fire Brigade talk from Molly Brown, who also spoke on the benefits of cadets in regards to students personal statements. Molly also turned down an impressive unconditional university offer to study History, and chose to instead pursue her dream to be a fire-fighter- she stated the skills learnt in cadets helped significantly in receiving her offer!

Our very own Safer Schools Police Officer PC Gunn was on hand with police colleagues, to speak on the rewards of a career in the police force. This was rounded off with a UCAS and Apprenticeships application panel, which was offered to students and their parents-in order to provide some extra help for what can be a tricky time period to navigate in regards to next steps.

Throughout the day there were career stalls stationed in the school hall to provide extra information to students, these included; University of Reading, Kingston University, Cardiff University, Roehampton University, University of Bath, University of Kent, Teach Wimbledon, ASK Apprenticeships, Cambridge Research, and finally, our very own T Level stand, to promote the work experience benefits that choosing these Level 3 qualifications at Ursuline Sixth Form will provide, and explain to students how beneficial this is to their future careers! 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Dear Parents, Carers and Friends,

We have all enjoyed the first Autumn half term, this has been reflected in the brilliant attendance of students, 96.7%. Well done to all students and their families. Our Progress 8 score for GCSE 2022 indicated that students gained on average ¾ of a grade higher in each subject at UHS, than students do nationally. 43% of all grades were at 7-9. Well done to Year 11 2021/22.

This week, students raised over £1000 for Period Poverty Charity in Zimbabwe as part of Show Racism The Red Card. Our Ursuline collaborations are growing stronger, with Year 10s planning future joint activities between Ursuline schools in England. We continue to strengthen our links with Ursuline schools worldwide, with students on an exchange at Ursuline Academy in Dallas this week, while last month we hosted a sixth form student from St Angela Merici High School in Slovakia.

We joyfully celebrated the life of Sr Anne Beynon, former Headteacher at Ursuline, with our choir singing beautifully at her funeral. During the summer holidays past students gathered in school to pay their respects and celebrate the life of Chelsea Mazava-Madaka, who died unexpectedly at the age of 21. Chelsea had many friends in school and was well known. We extend our prayers and condolences to Chelsea's family, and all our families who have lost loved ones this year.

A huge thank you to the UPA for their £7,000 donation, this will gratefully be used towards equipment for the newly refurbished vocational building, which includes T Level Nursing and Business.
