


An Horrific Success...!!



The much loved horror-comedy rock musical the Little Shop of Horrors was brought to horrific life on the 6th and 7th December in our annual school production. Based on the 1960's film by *Rodger Corman* and later 1983 screenplay by *Charles Griffith*), Little Shop of Horrors tells the story of florist worker Seymour, who raises a plant (Audrey II, named after his fellow assistant Audrey) that feeds on human blood and flesh. When his boss Mr Mushnick falls on hard times, Audrey II brings the shop and Seymour fame and fortune along the way, but at what cost? *Aisling* played the stingy, dishonest shop owner Mr Mushnik excellently, while *Daisy* voiced the

creepy and ever-demanding "Feed me Seymour" plant **Audrey II**, Hope gave a particularly stand-out performance as sadistic, controlling boyfriend **Orin**, while you couldn't help feeling slightly sorry for *Isabella's* hapless but well meaning **Seymour** and *Jennifer & Kiara*- were certainly both well cast as Seymour's long time crush **Audrey** (*Thursday and Friday respectively*).

LSOH's pacy music, (composed by *Menken*) in the style of early 1960's rock and roll, doo-wop and early Motown featured many well known songs including "*Skid Row* (*Downtown*)", "Somewhere That's Green", and "Suddenly,

Seymour" and was superbly played and sung by our fantastically talented band and melodic choir (and cast!).
