This Year's Transition Process

Summer Term:

- Parents' Welcome Evening
- Student assessment in English and Maths (13th May, 9am-12.30pm)
- Additional support meetings for SEND students (June)
- 1:1 in person meetings between the tutor, parents and student (26th-28th June)
- Transition day (5th July)
- Data Collection via Applicaa



Assessment in May

Reading: 60 mins; Writing: 25 mins

Maths: 60 mins

The Reading and the Maths assessments are used for grouping students.

They inform our teaching in September as teachers know the students' strengths and weaknesses and any skills gaps before they start school. Students' assessments will be used as the baseline piece of work to show individual progress over the Autumn term.



Assessment in May

Assessment Day: **Saturday 13th May**. Students will attend from **9am-12.30pm**. Students with SEN will have access to their additional time and be in a private room with the SENCO.

Arrive at Crescent Road entrance at 9am.

- Wear current school uniform.
- Bring 2 pens, 1 pencil, 1 rubber and 1 ruler
- Bring a snack and a bottle of water (Please be aware we are a nut free school).

School Canteen

School lunches are compulsory when students are in school.

- Cashless system: parents put credit onto their daughter's account either online via ParentPay or at school office.

- Parent/Carer The information provided on the online data form regarding your child's additional needs is a key part of identification and will inform our individual communication with you in June and July.
- Medical reports and information from other agencies If your child has an assessment report that you can share with us, please provide details.
- Primary Schools We will receive primary school files and information from primary SENDCo. The UHS SENDCo will attend any Year 6 annual reviews for students with an EHCP this term. The SENDCo will attend the Merton Transition event with primary schools in June 2023.



School Laptop Scheme Information


- The School Development Fund finances our School Tablet Scheme in addition to various other project & facilities around the school.

Pastoral Care and Inclusion

"The Ursuline really encourages us to become strong, independent women. Staff are concerned with developing and caring for the whole person as well as achieving the best academic results."

- Our pastoral care starts with the tutor that your daughter will see daily and discuss tasks around mindfulness, wellbeing and respect.
- Further support is provided by your pastoral support assistant who work alongside the Head of Year to give guidance and can help find out the right support
- Clear support and guidance on issues such as sexual harassment, gender equality,
 LGBT and Racism and all students are clear on hoe to refer and incident
- Focus on health and wellbeing is at the forefront of our PSHEC/RSE curriculum with your daughter's tutor and it is an excellent way to express and develop her knowledge on physical and mental wellbeing as well has how to have successful relationships and other topical issues in society.
- We also understand that we are journeying alongside parents and work together to best support your daughter and you as a parent.



Inclusion

Every child is treated with respect and equity. Our school equality targets are updated annually to ensure the school in implementing the Equality Act 2010.

- 1. All staff are clear on how to deal with an incident of racism and the appropriate action and response so that students are treated fairly and equally
- 2. To improve knowledge, skills and attitudes to enable our pupils to appreciate and value difference and diversity of our LGBT+ community
- 3. To increase the uptake of students taking the T level course so that young women are given the given equal opportunities to enter into all career pathways such as STEM.



Safety and Wellbeing





- Our first priority is to ensure all students are staff in school and that is from all issues such as
- Abuse of all nature
- Peer on peer abuse
- Harassment
- Racism
- Bullying

We have a zero-tolerance policy and we have a dedicated Safeguarding team that students can report any incident to as well as a dedicated pastoral team for each year group.

As per of our safeguarding practice, we share information and work in partnership with other agencies when there are concerns about a young person's welfare.

We will ensure that our concerns about our students are discussed with their parents/carers first unless we have reason to believe that such a move would be contrary to the young person's welfare.

We have an extensive network of agencies and staff that can offer support to any young person and their family. We can also offer advice to signpost families in need of help.



Mental Health and Wellbeing



Our focus on Wellbeing is further supported by being part of the South-West London Mental health Trailblazer.

This partnership provides mental health support teams that work with students and their parents with the aim of ensuring they are well equipped to have healthy and honest conversations about emotional wellbeing – as well as connecting them to local services.

This has enabled us to develop the services we have on offer at the Ursuline such as; a clinical psychologist, an emotional wellbeing nurse and Education Well-being practitioners who focus on sleep hygiene, low mood and anxiety issues.

Safety and Security

The school uses *online monitoring software (Smoothwall)* to ensure the use of school devices is appropriate and safe. **This is 24-hour monitoring.**

- Our parents need to have knowledge and understanding of the apps and programmes used to avoid any issues. It is essential that parents monitor usage outside of school too.
- We will be sending all parents Online safety training module to ensure all parents can support their daughters with online safety as they move to secondary this is with <u>Online Safety Alliance</u>.

All Year 7 students will have a thorough introduction to using their tablet.

This will include:

- Using the *internet safely and responsibly* information and sessions for both parents and students
- Dangers of social networks (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram)
- Cyber bullying
- Travelling to/from school






